# One Pager Checklist

- \_\_\_ 1. Title & Author – What is the title of the book and who wrote it? *Answer both questions.*
- \_\_\_ 2. Theme – What is the theme of the book?  
*(the main idea or message of the book)*
- \_\_\_ 3. Main character – Who are they? What problems do they have? What lessons do they learn?  
*Answer all three of these questions.*
- \_\_\_ 4. Quotes – Include 1-2 quotes from the book  
*Write 2 quotes that are important to the story.*
- \_\_\_ 5. Major events: Detail at least 2 major events in the story. *Write about two major (important) events in the story.*
- \_\_\_ 6. Illustrations: Make sure to include illustrations.  
*(drawings or pictures)*
- \_\_\_ 7. Color: Use colored pens, pencils, etc. Your one pager should not only be pencil. It should be colorful and visually inspiring.
